On Sunday we will celebrate the Solemnity of Christ the King, the last Sunday in the liturgical year. In the Church's calendar, Christ the King is the parallel of the FA Cup Final or the Wimbledon Final, or the Final of the World Cup. The Church's liturgical year concludes with this feast of Christ the King, instituted by Pope Pius XI in 1925 to celebrate the Jubilee Year and the 16th centenary of the Council of Nicaea. Instituting this feast, Pope Pius XI proclaimed: "Pax Christi in regno Christi" ("The peace of Christ in the reign of Christ"). This feast was established and proclaimed by the Pope to reassert the sovereignty of Christ and the Church over all forms of government and to remind Christians that they are citizens of the Kingdom of God.

Citizens of Christ's kingdom are expected to observe only one major law--the law of love. "Love God with your whole heart and love your neighbor as yourself." "If you love Me, you will keep My commandments." Jesus expects a higher degree of love from His followers: "Love one another as I have loved you."


