#### **General Information**

Home to School Communication: Next week all parents/carers will receive, via email, a link to a Class Charts Account. In order to improve home-school communication and give parents/carers more timely access to important information we have, this term, introduced Class Charts. As parent/carer you will receive access to information around attendance, punctuality, positive behaviour (House Points and Awards) as well as any information on poor behaviour and subsequent sanctions. You will also, in time, be able to see and track your son's homework.

The introduction of this system will be gradual as it is a new system. However, we are confident that this will improve the quality of the information that you receive. A Class Charts Parents Guide is available here.

The automated log-in email will be generated and sent next week. Please note that the automated email is sent by Class Charts not the school.

DTP/MenACWY School Based Vaccination Programme Year 9: Tuesday 30<sup>th</sup> January 2024: Teenage boosters are due in Year 9, Meningococcal ACWY (MenACWY) and Tetanus, Diphtheria and Poliomyelitis (Td/IPV) Vaccinations

The Health Security agency recommends that children aged 13 -14 years are given a vaccination against Meningitis ACWY, alongside the Td/IPV booster. Therefore, the NHS are offering the opportunity for your child to receive both vaccinations in school. MenACWY vaccination helps to protect against four different causes of meningitis and septicaemia: meningococcal groups A, C, W and Y. The Td/IPV 3-in-1 teenage booster completes the 5-dose course that provides long-term protection against tetanus, diphtheria, and polio.

The school-based immunisation team will be visiting St Cuthbert's on Tuesday 30th January 2024

The online consent can be accessed via any online device. Please click <a href="here">here</a> which will direct you to the consent form for you to complete. Please complete if you consent or non-consent to these vaccinations. In the rare event that you do not have access to the internet, please contact the immunisation team on the number below, who will complete a consent form with you over the phone. Please complete the consent form in full using the following school code: **NB137900** 

If a consent form is not completed by midday at least 48 working day hours before the day of the visit your child may not receive their immunisation at school.


