Moments Matter, Attendance Counts: You may have seen the government campaign highlighting the importance of excellent attendance at school. We reinforce this message. Excellent attendance is not only the starting point for excellent academic results but is preparing the boys for their future employment beyond school.

LOUDfence 3rd – 6th March 2024 : To show support to victims and survivors of abuse, St Mary's and St Nicholas' (Newcastle Anglican Cathedral) are hosting LOUDfence in March 2024 and all are welcome

to join. A LOUDfence involves tying LOUD (brightly coloured) ribbons and messages of support in public spaces. The aim is to give survivors a voice, create and raise awareness in the community and work to end abuse. This will be a joint LOUDfence event between the two Cathedrals running from Sunday 3rd March 2024 to Wednesday 6th March 2024.

There will be an opening Mass at St Mary's Cathedral on 3rd March at 11.30am presided by Bishop Stephen and a closing service at St Nicholas Cathedral on 6th March 2024.See letter <u>here</u> from Bishop Stephen.

Pupil Medical Appointments: If your son has a medical appointment which must take place during school hours, please write details in his planner. Your son must have this signed by his Year Office and can show this to his class teacher when he needs to leave for his appointment.

Please ensure your son is aware of the time and date of his appointment as it his responsibility to leave his lesson and go to pupil reception to be collected.

Parking on Gretna Road: When parking outside of school at the start and end of the day, please be considerate of our neighbours on Gretna Road. We have been informed by residents that cars have been blocking driveways leading residents to be late for work and appointments.

We would also like to remind parents that no cars should be parked on the yellow zig-zag lines outside of school on Gretna Road in restricted hours.

Regarding this matter, Newcastle City Council state that:

Vehicles should not block residents drives as this could result in a Penalty Charge Notice (PCN) being issued by the Local Authority.

Immediately outside of schools, there will often be yellow zig zag lines and the words "School Keep Clear" in place to help ensure that the area immediately outside the school is kept clear for safety reasons. A vehicle may not stop on zig zag lines during the restricted no stopping times. This parking restriction also applies to Disabled Blue Badge holders. <u>Source</u>.

Year 10		What laws do l need to know about?	What does the Sexual Offences Act 2003 say about Stealthing?	This week your son will learn what the Sexual Offences Act 2003 says about 'Stealthing'. Stealthing is a new term which describes when a person removes (or deliberately damages) a condom during sex without their partner knowing. It is illegal and it classed as a form of rape because it removes 'freedom' and 'choice' from the law's definition of consent. Stealthing was explored last year, in the BBC One drama "I May Destroy You". The main character Arabella has sex with a man who removes the condom without her knowledge. Like many women, Arabella doesn't realise it's rape until she hears it discussed on a podcast. The clip below shows Arabella giving her thoughts on why someone would commit the crime of stealthing. Year 11		What crimes should I be aware of?	What is gun and gang crime?	Prison data from 2020 shows us that 95.9% of people in prisons are male, 31.7% are aged under 30 and 46% of men are in prison for violent/drug related crime- often linked to gangs. This is a staggering, disproportionate amount of young men. Please read the information below from Northumbria Police with your son.
