Year 11 Transition to Sixth Form: During the week beginning 26th February our Year 11 pupils will be taking part in a range of taster lessons linked with Sixth Form courses. They will also be taking part in a range of co-curricular activities on Wednesday 28th February, options including cooking, politics, PE, Football Academy, Basketball Academy, Finance, Clay and Mandarin. Your son needs to fill in the Co-Curricular MS Form which can be found on his Year 11 IAG Teams page.

This will give our Year 11 pupils a good indication of what Sixth Form Life is like. Sixth Form Application and an Intended Destinations forms will be posted out with their Mock Exam results.

There will be further opportunity to experience a range of Sixth Form lessons after the Year 11 exams.
