General Information

Parking on Gretna Road: When parking outside of school at the start and end of the day, please be considerate of our neighbours on Gretna Road. We have been informed by residents that cars have been blocking driveways leading residents to be late for work and appointments.

We would also like to remind parents that no cars should be parked on the yellow zig-zag lines outside of school on Gretna Road in restricted hours. The restricted hours are between 8.00am and 5.00pm.

Regarding this matter, Newcastle City Council state that:

Vehicles should not block residents drives as this could result in a Penalty Charge Notice (PCN) being issued by the Local Authority.

Immediately outside of schools, there will often be yellow zig zag lines and the words "School Keep Clear" in place to help ensure that the area immediately outside the school is kept clear for safety reasons. A vehicle may not stop on zig zag lines during the restricted no stopping times. This parking restriction also applies to Disabled Blue Badge holders. <u>Source</u>.

Golf lessons at Close House Golf Club – Wednesday 1st May 2024 – Wednesday 26th June 2024: We have secured a fantastic opportunity for up to 12 pupils to receive group golf lessons at the prestigious Close House Golf Club. Please note that there is no cost for the lessons, and details are outlined below.

Your son will be transported via school minibus to Close House, located just outside Heddon on the Wall. Lessons begin at 4.00pm and your son will be returned to school via the school minibus for 5:15pm, unless arrangements are made to collect your son from the golf course's academy at 4:45pm.

The lessons are funded for a series of at least 6 lessons, every Wednesday night between the dates shown. Equipment is provided. There will be no lesson during half term. If your son is interested, they should speak to their PE teacher. They will be expected to attend all scheduled sessions as places are limited.

The boys will be supervised during the lessons by a member of St Cuthbert's PE staff, as well as receiving lessons from a PGA qualified golf academy coach from Close House Golf Club.
